New Sign at South Entrance to Victoria Park

The VPHA Board has voted to install a new "Victoria Park" sign at the south entrance, at S. 27th Pl. A grant application has been submitted to the City of Renton requesting half the cost to install this new sign. The grant is expected to be approved, but we won't know the final results of this application until late April or early May. Regardless, there will be a new sign at this entrance sometime this summer.

To accomplish this project and to satisfy the terms of the proposed grant, neighborhood volunteers will be needed to help install the sign, its protective roof, and the sign lighting. We need as many volunteers from the neighborhood as possible and if you have a craft to contribute, let us know. We may need a volunteer electrician (level 6 license), people with carpentry skills to build a roof over the new sign, and other non-specialists to dig, pound nails, or do whatever else is necessary.

Announcement - Coyote Warning

Coyotes have been spotted within Victoria Park many times in the first few months of 2008. Although the presence of coyotes in Victoria Park during winter months is nothing new, they may be present in larger numbers than has been previously experienced, and they have killed several cats and dogs. Homeowners are urged to take action as described below to avoid attacks on persons and pets.



According to the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife, attacks on humans by coyotes is relatively rare, although in 2006 two young children were bitten in Bellevue by coyotes while their parents were nearby. The coyotes unusually aggressive behavior in this instance likely resulted from being fed by people. Attacks by coyotes on dogs and cats is not unusual, and should be considered common in urban settings.

To minimize conflicts with coyotes, the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife encourages the use of the following strategies around your property and in your community:

- * Don't leave small children unattended where coyotes are frequently seen or heard.
- * Never feed coyotes.
- * Don't give coyotes access to garbage.
- * Prevent access to fruit (from trees) and compost.
- * Feed dogs and cats indoors.
- * Don't feed feral cats.
- * Keep dogs and cats indoors, especially from dusk to dawn.
- * Modify the landscape around children's play areas (i.e., prune trees and shrubs so coyotes can't hide in them).

* Build a coyote-proof fence.
