Parking Enforcement: Our Number One Complaint

The VPHA Board and VPHA Officers are a resource and your contact point for issues concerning our neighborhood and our neighbors. The one issue resulting in more calls and communication with VPHA Board Members than anything else is automobiles and parking enforcement.

This is also an issue over which the VPHA Board has no control; it is a matter to be taken up directly with the Renton Police Department.

The city publishes an informational web-page, Parking Enforcement Information and Questions. It can be found at this web address: https://rentonwa.gov/living/default.aspx?id=6642

Excerpts include the following:

found in the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) Chapter 46.61.570.

In brief, this law states where parking is prohibited including * sidewalks

- * planting strips
- * on a crosswalk
- close as practicable to the right edge of the right-hand shoulder."
- within the City of Renton.

If the department receives a complaint of a vehicle parked on a sidewalk in a residential area, the Parking Enforcement Controller will respond and the Parking Enforcement Controller will cite the offending vehicle and also enforce all parking regulations in the neighborhood.

· Parking Enforcement Controllers focus their enforcement efforts primarily in the downtown area, but they will travel to other destinations if there are complaints called into 9-1-1.

They normally work Monday through Saturday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

· Q - Can I park my car on a city street or city right-ofway in front of my house? A - Yes, but vehicles parked longer than 24 hours are considered abandoned.

To make a complaint about an illegally parked car in your neighborhood call 9-1-1.

The City of Renton has adopted State law in regards to parking regulations. This state law can be

* in front of a public or private driveway or within five feet of the end of the curb radius leading thereto.

• Another area of concern for the public is parking in residential areas facing the wrong direction. RCW 46.61.575 states that: "Every vehicle stopped or parked upon a two-way roadway shall be so stopped or parked with the right-hand wheels parallel to and within twelve inches of the right-hand curb or as
